### What is mentoring?



Mentoring: the activity of supporting and advising someone with less experience to help them develop in their work



- Mentoring comes in two forms;
- Deliberate or explicit ("meant")
   mentoring; achieved by training and
   support
- Accidental or implicit mentoring; achieved by inspiration and quite often, bloody immaculate timing



 Quite importantly both strands of mentoring are as equally valid!

 Mentoring, however achieved, in biological recording is the ultimate act of kindness, a true example of "paying it forward"









A history lesson for young people



The next three slides are of people who were fundamental in my own development over a period 1995 – 2005










#### timeline



- Following on from my first encounter with *Idioptera linnei* started to look at other species within the same habitat.
- Lack of reference material led to me publishing articles so I could reference at least my own articles about the species as none existed!
- Conceived MSc dissertation project to look at Idioptera genera within the UK. (submitted 2005)





Managed three projects at FSC from 2006 – 2014; Biodiversity Training Project (HLF-funded), Biodiversity Fellows (Defrafunded) and Invertebrate Challenge (HLF-funded) – these all included a lot of planned mentoring – particularly Invertebrate Challenge












When asked about the best bit of the slug event an attendee remarked –

Invertebrate Usage in Radiohead songs


